Advice on Adding Additional Firearms

Recently there have been many rejections by WAPOL in relation to firearm additions being refused, mainly due to forms not completed accurately, sections missed out or the need to satisfy Section 11A of the Firearms Act, "Genuine reason"

SSAA WA have assisted in many applications being resubmitted due to the genuine reason not satisfying the Police, some examples used were "bunny busting", "fun shooting" and "yippee shooting", these reasons were not accepted. The two most common genuine reasons acceptable according to the Act are either club endorsement or recreational/hunt.

In regard to recreational/hunt, the firearm and accompanying 'property letter' must be of an appropriate calibre for the property size and type of vermin to be controlled, so if you apply for a large calibre to shoot camels on a 300-acre property in the Albany region it will most likely be rejected as the property size may be deemed too small for the calibre and there are no camels around Albany. Your genuine need is to reflect in a justifiable manner for which you intend to use the firearm and specific types of vermin appropriate to the calibre. Also do not use Australian native wildlife as all species are protected unless permits or tags for control are issued by a relative government department.

All applications are scrutinised in minute detail by the Police and any anomaly or mistake may result in rejection which causes delay and frustration for the applicant.

Take your time and pay attention to detail such as serial numbers, when filling out the online application form, check and re-check all details provided.

If you wish to acquire a firearm in the same calibre you already own then the reason must satisfy a genuine need and a letter justifying that genuine need should accompany the application, just because it was granddads 22 Lithgow that he owned 50 years ago does not meet the genuine need criteria, not here in WA any way.

Recently the Vice President has assisted many members to resolve rejection issues and he is only too happy to assist and provide information that will result in a successful application.

Red Card For Foxes

Red Cards are well underway with nearly 30 events registered so far between February and April. Across regional WA.

Some recent results include the Williams Red Card Fox Shoot where the total for the weekend tally was 306 foxes 71 rabbits 11 feral cats 5 pigs. Boyup Brook have reported ja whopping 700 foxes and Miling came in with 289 foxes shot by only 14 teams.





Mobile Shooting Range

Soon you will start seeing our new Mobile Shooting Range out and about. She will be travelling to various Field Days, Agricultural Shows and other public events. As well, we have been approached by some secondary schools to bring 'big bertha' along to educate students on the safe, fun sport that is shooting. We are looking forward to getting her out on the road.

Discipline in focus......

The original Fly shoot was created here in Australia in 1990 for centrefire rifles at 500m. Since then a number of clubs that didn't have ranges out to 500m decided to use the same target at 200m and bring out the Rimfire rifles. Benchrest Fly has grown rapidly in popularity.

The Rifles

The Rimfire match allows the use of any .22LR rimfire rifle and the total maximum weight of the rifle must not exceed 7.711kg.

The Centrefire match includes a Light and Heavy class, with both allowing any legal, registered centrefire rifle up to and including .49-calibre. In the Light class, the total maximum weight of the rifle including a bipod must not exceed 7.711kg, while in the Heavy class, the rifle may have an unlimited weight, but it must be manually lifted onto the bench.



Scoring

The scoring for Fly incorporates both score and group results. It is primarily a score shooting match but bonus points are awarded for the group size.

In a 7 minute period the shooters are only allowed to fire 8 rounds of which only 5 of those must be placed on the record target. The other 3 are "sighters" and can be

Fly Shoot


fired at a separate sighting card.

The Fly target has a 10 ring with a blow fly in the centre. The 5 scoring shots will be given a value according to where they land in the scoring rings of the Fly target. If you hit the fly you get a bonus X added to the total score.



One of the great attractions of this event is the emphasis on fun. There are only 10 rules and they are printed on the targets. Rule 10 says "Any competitor caught not having fun will be disqualified" A Fly patch is awarded to those who hit a fly regardless of their placing in a match. These are highly sought after.
