## **Establishment of Wanneroo Shooting Complex**



On Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> May a ceremony was held to unveil a plaque commemorating the formation of the First WA SSAA branch. Invited guests included Hon. Rick Mazza MLC, Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts JP, SSAA

WA President Ron Bryant, the founding members, family and friends .

The initial range used by the former members of the WA Benchrest Rifle Club & from February 1971 by the inaugural members of SSAA (WA) was known as the Chidlow Rifle Range, which was under the control of the WA Rifle Association.

It was a concern that should it eventuate to not have access to a suitable range in the future this could have dire consequences in the fight to have SSAA(WA) officially recognised. Hence, whilst the priority action for official recognition continued, efforts to find a home were also undertaken. This culminated in late 1971 when the Conservator of Forests identified an area known as Mullaloo that could contain an area of land suitable for establishing a range.

This was an exciting breakthrough as existing sandhills also provided many natural butts, which would greatly reduce establishment costs. It didn't take long to find a suitable area with minimal vegetation & only one large dead tree that would require removal.

An SSAA(WA) Range sign was duly erected at the entry point and all was go or so it was thought. Only after a couple of shoots, bad news came in the form of advice that the Government had now decided to rezone all this land for future residential use.

Consequently, the Wanneroo Shire advised work had to cease and they must immediately vacate the area.

The hunt was on again! Surprisingly quickly the Conservator of Forests and the Wanneroo Shire advised of a further parcel of land off Perry Road with the advice that the Government would look favourably towards issuing a lease in this area. This news proved to be a godsend as virtually at the same time the WA Rifle Association withdrew its support for any continued use of the Chidlow Range.

Graham Pow and Ray Edwards spent countless hours trekking various tracks looking for a suitable site that would meet immediate & future requirements.

Eventually, a portion was selected and in order to hasten the approval process and before anyone could change their minds, Graham decided to map it out using an army compass and again spent many hours pacing through virgin bush & mapped an area comprising of 8.9 hectares.

True to his word the Conservator of Forests subsequently signed a lease on 6 April 1972 granting tenure over a portion

of State Forest for the purposes of building a rifle and pistol range. SSAA(WA) finally had its own home.

Unlike the Mullaloo site there were no natural butts so one would have to be built and still with no funds this was a major issue. A savior came by way of Cyril Maccarone who had a bulldozer and he cleared the range site and built a massive butt. It is unclear how his involvement eventuated but Cyril's work was a grand gesture as he gave his time for free only requiring a contribution towards the fuel costs.

Work on establishing the benchrest facilities proved to be a hard task for the dedicated few who gave up many weekends to lay a lengthy roofed concrete pad along with constructing and installing numerous solid benches. Finally, it was completed and the decision was made to have the range officially opened.

On 11 June 1972, 16 months after SSAA(WA)'s initial establishment a large crowd of over 200 comprising of invited dignitaries, SSAA's National President, firearm company representatives and dealers, friends, family & the general public all witnessed Senator Tom Drake-Brockman fire Jim Nicholas's .222 into a bottle of Champagne declaring the Wanneroo Pinjar Range officially open.

Immediately after the senator was invited to fire a group of 5 shots into a 100 yard target. What the Senator didn't know was as his ability was not known and to avoid him being embarrassed, Jim had previously put 5 shots into another target with a reasonable spacing.

This target was hidden near the official target with the view if his group looked a bit ragged or he had missed a few they would be swapped. But he surprised all as he shot a very respectable 5 shot group. His target was signed, framed and presented to him at his Perth office.

In recognition of his dedication and hard work, the road into Wanneroo Shooting Complex has been named Graham Pow Drive after our inaugural SSAA WA President Graham Pow, without whom, we wouldnt be in the position we are today. SSAA (WA) has also grown to become WA's largest shooting body with many more SSAA clubs and ranges established under its banner with thousands of WA shooters now competing in their chosen sport with many still using this range's facilities.
